

There's a lot of discussion of Shangri-la's philosophy, most of which I agree with. I spent some time in the Hunza in Kashmir, which is said to be the model for Shangri-la, so I could especially appreciate the sense of awe the travelers feel at the setting. There's something about the Himalayas that inspires contemplation - maybe because you see first hand how small you are relative to the gigantic peaks surrounding you.
